Weekly Parent Tip: Letter Knowledge

Here are some fun and easy ways to help your child learn about letters:

- Sing the alphabet song over and over—slowing down for “l-m-n-o”.
- Write the alphabet and point to the letters as you sing the alphabet song.
- Read alphabet books together.
- As your child watches, print the letters of their name and say each letter as you write it.
- Help your child learn to write his or her name one step at a time.
- Notice and point out words that start with the same sound and letter.
- Point out words and letters all around—on signs, menus, newspapers, etc.



Haystacks

Ingredients: 1 (3 oz.) can chow mein noodles
1 (6 oz.) package butterscotch morsels
2 Tbsp. peanut butter

- Melt the butterscotch morsels and peanut butter together on low heat. Mix in noodles until well coated. Drop by teaspoonful on waxed paper. Let cool.

Kettle of Soup

Ingredients: 4 (14 1/2 oz.) cans
chicken broth

- 2 (14 1/2 oz.) cans vegetable broth
- 2 cups diced, cooked chicken
- 1 (12 oz.) bag egg noodles
- 3 cups frozen mixed vegetables

Bring cans of broth to a boil. Add chicken. Add noodles and simmer for 5 minutes. Add vegetables. Boil uncovered for about 8 minutes. Enjoy.
